#### What does the Bible say about attitude

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Jesus maintained a perfect attitude in every situation. He prayed about everything and worried about nothing. We too, should seek God's guidance about every aspect of our lives and allow Him to work out His perfect will. Jesus' attitude was never to become defensive or discouraged. His goal was to please the Father rather than to achieve His own agenda (John 6:38). In the midst of trials, He was patient, In the midst of suffering, He was hopeful. In the midst of blessing, He was humble. Even in the midst of ridicule, abuse, and hostility, He "made no threats...and did not retaliate, instead He entrusted Himself to Him who judges justly" (1 Peter 2:23).

Each time we try to control our circumstances, our future, and the people around us, we're only demonstrating that we want to be 'god'. God doesn't want us to become gods, Instead, He wants us to become like Him, taking on His values, His attitude, and His character. We are meant to "be made new in the attitude of your minds and put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness." (Ephesians 4:23-24)

Thus, the process of Christian growth requires our free-will commitment to walk in righteousness and holiness in all circumstances of our life, in all relationships.

Finally, we must always keep in mind that God's ultimate goal for His children (us) is not our comfort but the transformation of our minds into the attitude of godliness. He wants us to grow spiritually, to become like Christ. Christlikeness is all about transforming our minds, our attitudes, our relationships. Again Paul tells us, "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of our minds. (Romans 12:2)

Faithful relationship to God changes our relationships to the world, to our fellow man,

It is God's will that we develop the kind of mindset described in the Beatitudes of Jesus (*Matthew 5:1-12*), that we exhibit the fruit of the Holy Spirit (*Galatians 5:22-23*), that we emulate the principles in Paul's great chapter on love (1 Corinthians 13), and that we strive to pattern our lives after Peter's characteristics of an effective and productive life (2 Peter 1:5-8)

On Sunday, March 1st after Divine Liturgy and fellowship coffee, the Parish held its Annual General meeting (AGM). As of December 31, 2024 we have 40 registered members.. Our Parish Bylaws state that we must have 25% of membership for a quorum. Eighteen members attended. Everyone listened attentively to the reports. Our financial status is not the best and our lack of community spirit is a real problem. With the generous help of our parish volunteers as well as volunteers from outside our membership, we are able to survive. A friendly welcoming community is of the utmost importance.

This is the time of year, the Great Fast, when emphasizes is placed on forgiveness, repentance, respect and reflection. Be kind to yourself. Focus in on the prayers that the church has to offer at this time. Treat yourself. You deserve it.

#### Basic Breakdown of a Traditional Easter Basket

- ⇒ **Hard-boiled, decorated eggs (pysanka):** These symbolize new life and Christ's Resurrection, representing the Easter promise of a new beginning.
- ⇒ **Bread (Paska):** Symbolic of Christ as the "Bread of Life"
- ⇒ **Butter or lamb-shaped butter**: the lamb represents Christ as the "Lamb of God."
- ⇒ **Meat (such as ham or sausage):** These represen great joy and abundance and God's favor and generosity.
- ⇒ **Salt:** Some traditions include salt as a symbol of life, protection and purity.
- ⇒ **White Candle:** Placed in the basket to be lit during the blessing, it symbolizes Jesus as the light of the world.






#### Holy Unction: the Sacrament of Healing

Holy Unction is a sacramental act whereby the Church seeks wholeness and well-being for its members, especially the sick and the suffering. The service of Holy Unction consists of a modifies Orthros (Matins), a series of petitions and hymns, and seven Epistle and Gospel readings, accompanied by seven priestly prayers for blessing and sanctification of oil. Afterwards those who present are anointed with this healing oil. The Church does not ascribe "magical" healing properties to the oil, but rather sees in this action a concrete expression of love and concern for the wholeness and well-being of the person anointed.

The service of Holy Unction is always celebrated on Wednesday of Holy Week prior to Easter. It may also be celebrated on Clean Monday at the beginning of Lent, In addition, if a member of the Church has a special need, he or she may ask one the priests to perform a special service Holy Unction either in the Church or in the home or at medical facility.

This year a Holy Unction service will be celebrated on Wednesday, April 16th, 6 p.m. At St. Andrew's Ukrainian Orthodox Church (9831—75 St.)



## **Христос Воскрес!** Christ Is Risen!

Easter is the Christian holiday celebrating the Resurrection, or bringing back to life, of Jesus Christ three days after his crucifixion. In Christian tradition, the Resurrection represents Christ's victory over death and the promise of eternal life for those who follow him. Some Christians refer to Easter as Resurrection Day or Resurrection Sunday.

Easter always falls on a Sunday. Many churches will offer worship services on Good Friday (the Friday just before Easter) along with one or more services on Easter Sunday itself. Easter Sunday marks the end of the 46-day preparatory season of <u>Lent</u>, which is significant in cultures around the world.

The exact date of Easter varies from year to year, but it typically falls during the month of April or sometimes late March. This seasonal timing gives the holiday its strong associations with springtime and rebirth in the natural world. Easter icons such as eggs and tulips symbolize new life and renewed hope. Those are powerful ideas to embrace whether you celebrate Easter for religious reasons or simply because you enjoy the vibrant traditions that go along with the holiday.

May this season of renewal bring you an abundance of peace and overwhelming love. Wishing you warm wishes as you reflect this Easter Sunday, remember to keep moving forward. Hold close the Easter message that nothing – not even death – can match the power of faith, hope, and love. And we remember Jesus' sacrifice and recommit ourselves to love God with all our hearts and to love our neighbors as ourselves, embracing His call to treat one another with compassion.

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#### THE LEAVETAKING (APODOSIS) OF PASCHA

The Leavetaking of Pascha is observed on Wednesday of the sixth week after Pascha. On this day, the forty-day celebration of the Bright Resurrection of Christ comes to an end, and for the last time, we greet each other with the words of Paschal joy: "Christ is Risen!" We then prepare to celebrate the upcoming feast of the Ascension of the Lord.

#### Trinity Sunday

A Christian holy day, celebrates the doctrine of the Holy Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) and is observed on the Sunday of Pentecost in Eastern Christianity.


